

Community Action Project

(formerly known as the Local Action Team)

The purpose of this group is to work with police, community wardens, housing associations, local groups and other agencies to reduce local crime and disorder problems and to identify areas which may benefit from environmental improvement. The meetings are usually attended by most agencies. If you are affected by anti-social behaviour or have an idea for local improvement please attend our meetings which are held every three months usually in Tangmere or Oving Village Hall.

The group has access to funding via the Community Action Chest which is also open for applications from other groups and organisations.

The Spitfire Court project continues at a frustratingly slow pace, but the bank should be finished and planted up this year, and the fence to the rear of Tamar Way properties should be erected in the New Year. There is a long term plan to greatly improve the look of this area, to plant trees and to improve the footpath access. If you feel that you may be affected by this project in any way or have ideas for improving the area, please attend our meetings or alternatively contact the Chair.
